Application deadline

Nominations: partner university selects students according to performance, commitment and language skills and nominates them via our nomination platform.

1st semester or full academic year: **1st of May 2026**

2nd semester: **1st of October 2026**

Applications: After an acknowledgement-e-mail from ENSAG, students apply within our application period. Late applications can be refused.

1st semester or full academic year: **1st of June 2026**

2nd semester: **30 October 2026**

Once you are accepted as an exchange student, you will receive a letter of admission and information letter, allowing you to register as an exchange student.

Application procedure

Step 1 - Your home university should send your nomination via our nomination tool TAIGA before the application deadline, mentioning your name and email address.

Step 2 – You'll receive an email with the process to complete the online application procedure. Please do not forget to upload the supporting documents:

- ✓ official grade transcripts (including grade transcript and diploma from bachelor degree studies).
- ✓ Proof of **language qualification**. Students who do not have French as their native language are strongly recommended to get good knowledge of the French language, both written and spoken, equivalent to A2-B1 CEFR level. This may be a certificate issued by your local language teacher. For English lessons, a B2-CEFR English certificate is required.
- ✓ Learning agreement: signed by the applicant and the home university.
- ✓ Photocopy of the identity page of your passport or identity card.
- ✓ Only for European students: european Health Insurance Card

And, only for applicants in master programmes:

- ✓ A Portfolio
- ✓ Fill in the “choice of the studio” form
- ✓ Motivation letter in which you explain the choice for our programme

All documents should be uploaded in pdf-format. Incomplete applications will not be processed. Only applications through our online system will be considered.

Tutions

There is no tuition at ENSAG. When the students arrive in France, they will have to subscribe a School, civil liability and extracurricular insurance (cost around 16 €).

French course offer

Most subjects at Ensag are taught in French, and some in English. Ensag offers tutorial supports in French and English to students who request it whenever possible. Also note that some teachers may allow students to write assignments and take exams in English, but this situation can only be agreed upon arrival in each individual case.

International students can enroll in ENSAG our free “French as a Foreign Language” (FLE) courses to improve written and oral expression. The students will take a placement test at their arrival, in order to assess the level of knowledge and form homogeneous classes of learners: further information will be sent to students directly.

Welcome days
